The 1969 NCCC Convention was held in Daytona Beach July 8 to July 12, 1969, at the Daytona Plaza. Speed events were held at the Daytona Speedway. One of the attractions sponsored by the convention was a road trip to Marine Land in Flagler County. During the visit to Marine Land a dolphin was born. The management of Marine Land named the dolphin "Vette". Later the NCCC Board of Directors voted the Dolphin to be the Official mascot of the NCCC.
